Ponderings from Pastor Don:

## UNKNOWN

I am not a baseball fan. It requires patience to watch for hours even with pitcher and batter clocks. It also demands endurance to sometimes wait decades to see one's beloved team reach the world series. So I wish to honor those fanatical diehard fans of professional baseball's perennial underdogs like the Seattle Mariners.

Over the years I have gently hassled Mariners fans for their loyalty to a team that has infrequently managed to get into the playoffs (5 times in their 48 seasons). Undeterred, a stalwart Mariners fan's reliable rebuttal to my playful ribbing is remarkably consistent: "YOUNEVERKNOW." Yes, that's one word.

They often insist that the Mariners have a chance to prevail even when player performance and pitching prowess are generally far below more historically favored teams with more formidable and costly rosters. They contend that the Mariners have a chance for greatness even when their stats are sometimes underwhelming and the prospects are bleak.

Their statistical, mathematical or actuarial skills may have been lacking, but they offer an inspired answer — YOUNEVERKNOW. It's true. When you go to a ballgame, YOUNEVERKNOW. One night, there may be scoreless for umpteen innings (boring!) and the next night, it may be 18-17 in nine innings (slightly better!).

Of course, we don't know who will win the World Series. There are certainly those with expertise who can guess more reliably than I could. But even with their careful calculations and expert analysis, the outcome is still unknown. That gap between the known and unknown is where hope resides. That hope persists on opposing sides until the contest is decided. Then the dispirited fans of the losing team will reluctantly concede defeat and dejectedly replace YOUNEVERKNOW with NOWIKNOW.

I think the phrase YOUNEVERKNOW captures the vagaries of life in general. Most of us intrinsically know that life is unpredictable. Events are often random. Fate is uncertain. Chance is unreliable. Life is capricious. Defeat, failure and loss are common. Yet despite sometimes demoralizing odds, we can still leave ample room for unexpected blessings and good fortune. Miracles do happen. Surprise and serendipity can upset calamitous forecasts, upend solemn predictions and reverse dire prognostications (remember the defeated women who expected to see a bloodied a corpse but encountered the triumphant Jesus instead).

Conditions on this planet are increasingly dire and precarious. We live on a forbidding world that is populated with countless people poisoned by forbidden sins. And the beleaguered Christian charged to shine their light of love and charity in a world of corruption, injustice, hate, prejudice, gluttony and more may lament and wonder if the opposing side is winning. Sometimes we may feel like David facing Goliath minus the slingshot. But we need not despair. We can keep our faith and hold onto hope like Mariners fans do. YOUNEVERKNOW what God will do,

Our Lord is still rooting for the underdog and intervening on our behalf to prevail over every formidable opponent. The Holy Spirit still equips us to fearlessly face our adversaries unafraid. And our loving Savior who defeated death and darkness still assures us that God will win. So we can be confident that one day we will have glorious victory in Jesus.

Will that promised final victory happen this year? Next year? A decade from now? YOUNEVERKNOW. Meanwhile, stay strong. Don't lose hope. Keep the faith.

PS The Mariners suffered a stinging postseason defeat that will be felt for some time. Yet I imagine some fans are already hoping for a favorable season next year. YOUNEVERKNOW. We can hope...
